<u>CHAPTER - 1</u>

INTRODUCTION

Preamble to the Constitution

WE, THE PEOPLE OF INDIA, having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens:

JUSTICE, social, economic and political;

LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship;

EQUALITY of status and opportunity;

and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this Twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

The Right to Information Act, 2005 is a significant legislation in the history of the Indian democracy. The RTI Act, 2005 was enacted with the main objective of providing an effective framework for ensuring right to information guaranteed under Article 19 of the Constitution of India by setting out the practical regime of right to information for citizens and to secure access to information under the control of public authorities for the purpose of promoting transparency and accountability in the working of

every public authority. The RTI Act is a powerful tool as it empowers citizens to get information from the Public Authorities as a matter of right. The Right to Information Act, 2005 came into effect from 12th October, 2005.

The RTI Act, 2005 made the governance processes of the country accessible to all citizens. The Act takes democracy to the grass roots level and it is a progressive step towards bringing participatory governance in the country.

<u>CHAPTER - 2</u>

Salient Features of the RTI Act, 2005

2.1. Information

AS per Section 2(f) of the RTI Act, "information" means any material in any form, including records, documents, memos, e-mails, opinions, advices, press releases, circulars, orders, logbooks, contracts, reports, papers, samples, models, data material held in any electronic form and information relating to any private body which can be accessed by a public authority under any other law for the time being in force.

2.2. Public Authority

1. As per Section 2(h) of the RTI Act, a 'Public Authority' means any authority or body or institution of self Government established or constituted by or under the Constitution, any other law made by Parliament, any other law made by State

Legislature and by notification issued or order made by the appropriate Government and includes any 'body' owned, controlled or substantially financed and non-Government organization substantially financed directly or indirectly by funds provided by the appropriate Government.

2.3. Right to Information

As per Section 2(j) of the RTI Act, "right to information" means the right to information accessible under this Act which is held by or under the control of any public authority and includes the right to inspection of work, documents, records, taking notes, extracts or certified copies of documents or records, taking certified samples of material, obtaining information in the form of diskettes, floppies, tapes, video cassettes or in any other electronic mode or through printouts where such information is stored in a computer or in any other device.

2.4. Obligations of Public Authorities

Section 4 of the RTI Act provides for obligations of Public Authorities for mandatory publication of information on various aspects of the Public Authority. It also emphasizes the need to be computerized all the records that are appropriate and connected through a network all over the Country on different systems so that access to such records is facilitated.

2.5. Designation of Public Information Officers

As per Section 5 of the RTI Act, every Public Authority shall, within one hundred days of the enactment of the Act, designate as many officers as Public Information Officers in all administrative units or offices under it as may be necessary to provide information to persons requesting for the

information under this Act. Every Public Authority shall also designate an officer at each sub-divisional level or other sub-district level as Assistant Public Information Officer to receive the applications for information or appeals under this Act for forwarding the same forthwith to the Public Information Officer or the Appellate Authority, as the case may be.

2.6. Time Frame

Section 7 of the Act lays down statutory time frame of 30 days for disposal of requests either for giving information or rejecting the same with reasons. The time frame for supply of information, which related to the life or liberty of a citizen, has been fixed as 48 hours only. An appeal under sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of Section 19 shall be disposed of within thirty days of the receipt of the appeal or within such extended period not exceeding a total of forty five days from the date of filing thereof, as the case may be, for reasons to be recorded in writing.

2.7. Exemption from Disclosure of Information

Exemption from disclosure of information under Section 8 of the Right to Information Act, 2005 are as follows:

- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, there shall be no obligation to give any citizen, -
 - (a) information, disclosure of which would prejudicially affect the sovereignty and integrity of India, the security, strategic, scientific or economic interests of the State, relation with foreign State or lead to incitement of an offence;

- (b) information which has been expressly forbidden to be published by any court of law or tribunal or the disclosure of which may constitute contempt of Court;
- (c) information, the disclosure of which would cause a breach of privilege of Parliament or the State Legislature;
- (d) information including commercial confidence, trade secrets or intellectual property, the disclosure of which would harm the competitive position of a third party, unless the competent authority is satisfied that larger public interest warrants the disclosure of such information;
- (e) information available to a person in his fiduciary relationship, unless the competent authority is satisfied that the larger public interest warrants the disclosure of such information;
- (f) information received in confidence from foreign Government;
- (g) information, the disclosure of which would endanger the life or physical safety of any person or identify the source of information or assistance given in confidence for law enforcement or security purposes;
- (h) information which would impede the process of investigation or apprehension or prosecution of offenders;
- (i) cabinet papers including records of deliberations of the council of ministers, Secretaries and other officers:

Provided that the decisions of Council of Ministers, the reasons thereof, and the material on the basis of which the

decisions were taken shall be made public after the decision has been taken, and the matter is complete, or over:

Provided further that those maters which come under the exemptions specified in this Section shall not be disclosed;

of which has no relationship to any public activity or interest, or which would cause unwarranted invasion of the privacy of the individual unless the Central Public Information Officer or the State Public Information Officer or the Appellate Authority, as the case may be, is satisfied that the larger public interest justifies the disclosure of such information:

Provided that the information which cannot be denied to the Parliament or a State legislature shall not be denied to any person.

As per Section 9 of the Right to Information Act, 2005, without prejudice to the provisions of Section 8 of the said Act, a Public Information Officer may reject a request for information, where such a request for providing access would involve an infringement of copy right subsisting in a person other than the State.

As per Section 24(4) of the Right to Information Act, 2005, nothing contained in this Act shall apply to such intelligence and security organization being organizations established by the State Government, as that Government may from time to time, by notification in the Official Gazette, specify:

Provided that the information pertaining to the allegations of corruption and human rights violations shall not be excluded under this sub-section:

Provided further that in the case of information sought for is in respect of allegations of violation of human rights, the information shall only be provided after the approval of the State Information Commission and, notwithstanding anything contained in section 7, such information shall be provided within forty-five days from the date of the receipt of request.

2.8. Overriding effect

As per Section 22 of the RTI Act, the provisions of this Act shall have overriding effect over any other law including the Official Secrets Act, 1923.

2.9. Three tier Mechanism under RTI Act

Under the RTI Act, 2005, a three tier Mechanism is prescribed for enforcing the Right to Information. The Public Information Officer at the first level who is responsible for providing the requested information by an RTI petitioner as expeditiously as possible and in any case within 30 days of the receipt of the request, the Appellate Authority at the second level for deciding the first appeal and the State Information Commission at the third level when a Second appeal / Complaint is filed.

CHAPTER - 3

3.1. Constitution of the Tamil Nadu Information Commission

The Tamil Nadu Information Commission was constituted under Section 15(1) of the Right to Information Act, 2005 vide notification issued in G.O.(Ms).No.988 Public (Estt.I & Legislation) Department dated 07.10.2005.

3.4. Powers and Functions of the State Information Commission

The RTI Act, 2005 prescribes the powers and functions of the Commission in Sections 18, 19 and 20 in dealing with complaints, appeals and penalties respectively.

Disposal of complaints under Section 18 of the Right to Information Act, 2005:

- (1) Under the provision of Section 18 of the Right to Information Act, 2005, it shall be the duty of the State Information Commission to receive and inquire into a complaint from any person;
 - who has been unable to submit a request to a State Public Information Officer either by reason that no such officer has been appointed

under this Act, or because the State Assistant Public Information Officer has refused to accept his or her application for information or appeal under this Act for forwarding the same to the State Public Information Officer or Senior Officer specified in subsection (1) of section 19 or the State Information Commission, as the case may be;

- who has been refused access to any information requested under this
 Act;
- who has not been given a response to a request for information or access to information within the time limit specified under this Act;
- who has been required to pay an amount of fee which he or she considers unreasonable;
- who believes that he or she has been given incomplete, misleading or false information under this Act; and
- in respect of any other matter relating to requesting or obtaining access to records under this Act.
- (2) Where the State Information Commission is satisfied that there are reasonable grounds to inquire into the matter, it may initiate an inquiry in respect thereof.

- (3) The State Information Commission shall, while inquiring into any matter under this section, have the same powers as are vested in a Civil Court while trying a suit under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908, in respect of the following matters, namely:-
 - (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of persons and compel them to give oral or written evidence on oath and to produce the documents or things;
 - (b) requiring the discovery and inspection of documents;
 - (c) receiving evidence on affidavit;
 - (d) requisitioning any public record or copies thereof from any court or office;
 - (e) issuing summons for examination of witnesses or documents; and
 - (f) any other matter which may be prescribed
- (4) Notwithstanding anything inconsistent contained in any other Act of Parliament or State Legislature, as the case may be, the State Information Commission may during the inquiry of any complaint under this Act, examine any record to which this Act applies which is under the control of the public authority, and no such record may be withheld from it on any grounds.

Disposal of Appeals under Section 19 of the Act:-

(1) Any person who, does not receive a decision within the time specified in subsection (1) or clause (a) of sub-section (3) of section 7, or is aggrieved by a

decision of the State Public Information Officer, may within thirty days from the expiry of such period or from the receipt of such a decision prefer an appeal to such officer who is senior in rank to the State Information Officer in each public authority;

Provided that such officer may admit the appeal after the expiry of the period of thirty days if he or she is satisfied that the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from filing the appeal in time.

- (2) Where an appeal is preferred against an order made by the State Information Officer under section 11 to disclose third party information, the appeal by the concerned third party shall be made within thirty days from the date of the order.
- (3) A second appeal against the decision under sub-section(1) shall lie within ninety days from the date on which the decision should have been made or was actually received, with the State Information Commission.

Provided the State Information Commission may admit the appeal after the expiry of the period of ninety days if it is satisfied that the appellant was prevented by sufficient cause from filing the appeal in time.

(4) If the decision of the State Public Information Officer against which an appeal is preferred relates to information of a third party, the State Information Commission shall give a reasonable opportunity of being heard to that third party.

- (5) In any appeal proceedings, the onus to prove that a denial of a request was justified shall be on the State Public Information Officer who denied the request.
- (6) An appeal under sub-section(1) or sub-section(2) shall be disposed of within thirty days of the receipt of the appeal or within such extended period not exceeding a total of forty five days from the date of filing thereof, as the case may be, for reasons to be recorded in writing.
- (7) The decision of the State Information Commissioner shall be binding.
- (8) In its decision, the State Information Commission has the power to -
 - (a) require the public authority to take any such steps as may be necessary to secure compliance with the provisions of this Act, including:-
 - i) by providing access to information, if so requested, in a particular form;
 - ii) by appointing a State Public Information Officer;
 - iii) by publishing certain information or categories of information;
 - iv) by making necessary changes to its practices in relation to the maintenance, management and destruction of records;
 - v) by enhancing the provision of training on the right to information for its officials;

- vi) by providing it with an annual report in compliance with clause(b) of sub-section (1) of section 4;
- (b) require the public authority to compensate the complainant for any loss or other detriment suffered;
- (c) impose any of the penalties provided under this Act;
- (d) reject the application.
- (9) The State Information Commission shall give notice of its decision, including any right to appeal, to the complainant and the public authority.
- (10) The State Information Commission shall decide the appeal in accordance with such procedure as may be prescribed.

Penalties under Section 20 of the Act:

(1) Where the State Information Commission at the time of deciding any complainant or appeal is of the opinion that the State Public Information Officer has without any reasonable cause, refused to receive an application for information or has not furnished information within the time specified under sub-section (1) of section 7 or malafidely denied the request for information or knowingly given incorrect, incomplete or misleading information or destroyed information which was the subject of the request or obstructed in any manner in furnishing the information, it shall impose a penalty of two hundred and fifty rupees each day till application is received or

information is furnished, so however, the total amount of such penalty shall not exceed twenty five thousand rupees.

Provided the State Public Information Officer shall be given a reasonable opportunity of being heard before any penalty is imposed on him.

Provided further that the burden of proving that he acted reasonably and diligently shall be on the State Public Information Officer.

(2) Where the State Information Commission, at the time of deciding any complaint or appeal is of the opinion that the State Public Information Officer has, without any reasonable cause and persistently, failed to receive an application for information or has not furnished information within the time specified under subsection (1) of section 7 or malafidely denied the request for information or knowingly given incorrect, incomplete or misleading information or destroyed information which was the subject of the request or obstructed in any manner in furnishing the information, it shall recommend for disciplinary action against the State Public Information Officer under the service rules applicable to him.

<u>CHAPTER - 4</u>

4.1. Rules Notified under the RTI Act, 2005

As per Section 27(1) of the RTI Act, 2005, the appropriate Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules to carry out the provisions of this Act. Similarly as per Section 28(1) of the

RTI Act, 2005, the competent authority may, by notification in the Official Gazette, make rules to carry out the provisions of this Act.

4.2. Fees to be paid under the Tamil Nadu Right to Information (Fees) Rules, 2005

The Government of Tamil Nadu vide G.O.Ms.No.989 Public (Estt I & Legislation) Department, dated 07.10.2005 has notified the Tamil Nadu Right to Information (Fees) Rules, 2005. Subsequently certain amendments were issued to the said rules vide G.O.Ms.No.1012 Public (Estt I & Legislation) Department, dated 20.09.2006, G.O.Ms.No.72 Personnel and Administrative Reforms (AR III) Department, dated 20.03.2007 and G.O.Ms.No.12 Personnel and Administrative Reforms (AR III) Department dated 09.02.2011. 4.5. The Tamil Nadu Information Commission (Appeal Procedure) Rules, 2012

The Tamil Nadu Information Commission (Appeal Procedure) Rules, 2012 have been notified in G.O.Ms.No.137 Personnel and Administrative Reforms (AR-III) Department, dated 03.09.2012. These Rules lay down the procedure to be followed by the Appellants for filing of second appeals to the Tamil Nadu Information Commission and also the procedure involved in deciding the appeals.

<u>CHAPTER - 5</u>

Online Filing of Second Appeals

The Government of Tamil Nadu vide G.O.(D).No.174, Personnel and Administrative Reforms (AR-III) Department dated 18.10.2016 have sanctioned a sum of Rs.29,34,000/- towards the cost of Hardware items and software development for the introduction of "Online Filing of Second Appeals" and Office Automation Process in the Tamil Nadu Information Commission. The Government vide G.O.Ms.No.8 Personnel Administrative Reforms (AR-III) Department dated 22.01.2018 have sanctioned a further amount of Rs.5.48 lakhs for the above programme. The software development for Online Filing of Second Appeals was done by the National Informatics Centre, Secretariat, Chennai - 600 009. After successful testing, the Commission has enabled Online Filing of Second Appeals "on its website address www.tnsic.gov.in with effect from 13.08.2018. The total number of Second Appeals received through Online Filing during 2018 is 32.

<u>CHAPTER – 6</u>

6.1. RTI Week Celebrations - 2018

The RTI Week Celebrations organized by the Tamil Nadu Information Commission was inaugurated by Thiru. Banwarilal Purohit, Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu at a function held at Raj Bhawan, Guindy on 5th October, 2018, by lighting Kuthuvilakku to mark the inauguration of RTI Week Celebrations - 2018. Dr.M.Sheela Priya, I.A.S. (Retd.), State Chief Information Commissioner delivered the Welcome address. Thiru.R.Rajagopal, I.A.S., Additional Chief Secretary to Governor, all the Information Commissioners of Tamil Nadu Information Commission, Dr.S.Swarna, I.A.S., Secretary to Government, Personnel Administrative Reforms Department, Tmt.P.Nirmala, I.A.S., (Retd.) Chairperson, Commission for Protection of Civil Rights, Tmt. R.Vasuki, I.A.S. (Retd.). Chairperson, Tamil Nadu State Food Commission, Dr.S.Ayyar, I.A.S. (Retd.), Tamil Nadu Local Bodies Ombudsman, Dr.A.Chittaranjan Mohandoss, I.A.S. (Retd.), Former Secretary to Government, Public Department and other dignitaries participated in the function.

6.2. Special Address by the Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu

The Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu in his Special Address mentioned that the Celebrations are meant to publicly pronounce to the World, the power of the people to obtain information from the Government a right which was denied to them under the system of administration put in place by the British Centuries ago.

The Hon'ble Governor recalled the evolution of the RTI Act in India which was made possible by sustained struggle of the people led by the Mazdoor Kisan Shakthi Sangathan and other Non Governmental Organisations in several parts of the Country. A National Campaign for People's Right to Information was formed in August, 1996 and it played a significant role in exerting its weight behind the introduction of a legislation for the Right to Information. During the course of implementation of the RTI Act for more than a decade, as rightly pointed out by our Hon'ble Prime Minister Thiru. Narendra Modiji, it has become a tool for 'Good Governance'. It is also seen that the information seekers use the RTI Act not just to access information, but also to address their grievances. Of late the RTI Act is getting transformed as an enabling tool for redressal of grievances. The Hon'ble Governor in his concluding note said that he has been harping on the themes of honesty, transparency and efficiency in all his speeches and therefore more happy to be serving the cause of the Right to Information for it ensures transparency in governance. He said that with the passage of time measures and method of making use of the provisions of the Act will get refined even more resulting in greater benefits to the Common public. He called up on that all should contribute their energy to that effect.

6.3. Street Play on creating awareness on RTI Act

After the conclusion of the inauguration Programme, a Street Play on creating awareness on Right to Information Act was performed by indigent artists of the State under the guidance of Alternative Media Centre, Chennai.

7.1. Training on RTI

During the above programme 20 successful contestants for their "Success Stories on RTI Act, 2005" for the year 2018 were given a cash award of Rs.5,000/- each.

<u>CHAPTER - 8</u>

8.1. National Federation of Information Commissions in India (NFICI)

The National Federation of Information Commissions in India (NFICI) has been specially formed as a registered body on 01.09.2009 to facilitate co-ordination and mutual consultation among the Central Information Commission and the State Information Commissions constituted under the Right to Information Act, 2005. The Membership is open to all Information Commissions in India and they have to pay Rs.5.00 lakhs towards Admission Fee and an Annual Membership fee of Rs.1.00 lakh. The Tamil Nadu Information Commission has also enrolled as a member to the National Federation of Information Commissions in India, during the year 2011. The Headquarters of the NFICI is at New Delhi. The Tamil Nadu Information Commission has paid the Annual Membership fee to the National Federation of Information Commissions in India upto the period 2019 – 2020.

8.2. Sanction of grant from National Federation of Information Commissions in India

In the Special General Body Meeting of the National Federation of Information Commissions in India (NFICI) held at New Delhi on 20.08.2016, a decision was taken to release an amount of Rs.4 lakhs to each State Information Commission to utilize the same for public purpose by taking up a project keeping in view with the aims and objects of the National Federation of Information Commissions in India. Accordingly, the National Federation of Information Commissions in India has sanctioned Rs.4 lakhs to the Tamil Nadu Information Commission in September,

2016. It was decided by the Tamil Nadu Information Commission to utilize the above grant of Rs.4 lakhs sanctioned by the National Federation of Information Commissions in India to undertake study of various types of directions issued by the Commission on the second appeals, in order to create an effective mechanism to properly document and deal with such papers in the normal course of action. The Commission has accordingly vide Office Proceedings No.559/TNIC/Admin-I/2017 Dated 22.08.2017 has engaged two retired Under Secretaries to Government on contract basis on consolidated pay of Rs.15,000/- per month as study consultants for a period of ten months with effect from 23.08.2017. One typist has also been appointed on contract basis with a consolidate pay of Rs.10,000/- p.m. to assist the study consultants.

The National Federation of Information Commissions in India has sanctioned a further grant of Rs.4 lakhs to the Tamil Nadu Information Commission on 07.12.2018. The term of two consultants and one typist was extended for a further period of six months from 23.06.2018 vide Office Proceedings No.404/Admin-I/2018 Dated 04.07.2018.

8.3. Special General Body Meetings of National Federation of Information Commissions in India

Dr.M.Sheela Priya, I.A.S. (Retd.), State Chief Information Commissioner, Tamil Nadu Information Commission has participated in the Special General Body Meetings of National Federation of Information Commissions in India held at New Delhi on 20.01.2018 and 30.06.2018. The State Chief Information Commissioner has also participated in the Special General Body Meeting of National Federation of Information Commissions in India held at Jaipur on 28th and 29th September, 2018.

<u>CHAPTER - 9</u>

Annual Convention

The 13th Annual Convention of Central Information Commission was held at New Delhi on 12.10.2018. It was inaugurated by Hon'ble President of India, Thiru.Ram Nath Kovind.

Dr.M.Sheela Priya, I.A.S., (Retd.), State Chief Information Commissioner and Thiru.S.Muthuraj, State Information Commissioner, Tamil Nadu Information Commission had participated in the above Annual Convention.

CHAPTER - 10

10.1. Preparation of Annual Report - 2018

As per Section 25(1) of the RTI Act, 2005, the Commission is required to prepare a report after the end of each year, on the implementation of the provisions of this Act during that year and a copy thereof is to be forwarded to the appropriate Government, which in turn will lay it before the State Legislature.

As per section 25(2) of the RTI Act, 2005, each Ministry or Department shall, in relation to the public authorities within their jurisdiction collect and provide information to the Commission as is required to prepare the report. The Annual Report-2018 has been prepared based on the particulars received from the Public Authorities on the implementation of RTI Act during the year 2018.

10.2. RTI applications handled by the Public Authorities during the year 2018

The particulars showing number of requests made to each Public Authority and amount of charges collected, number of requests rejected under various provisions of the RTI Act, disposal of RTI applications by the Public Information Officers and disposal of first appeals by the Appellate Authorities during the year 2018 are shown in the Annexure to this report.



10.6. Disposal of First Appeals by the First Appellate Authorities

During the year 2018, a total of 31,392 first appeals were handled by the first Appellate Authorities and out of which 28,590 first appeals were disposed by providing information. The number of first appeals rejected was 1,271 and the pending number of first appeals as on 31.12.2018 was 1,531.

10.7. Any Special Effort taken in the Departments to promote spirit and intent of RTI Act [Section 25(3)(f)] – as reported by the departments

Directorate of Agriculture

As per this Office Letter No.RTI2/39449/2018 dated 19.04.2018, the details of Public Information Officers and First Appellate Authorities at Directorate of Agriculture, District Level and Block Level were updated in www.tn.gov.in\rti

Commissionerate of Commercial Taxes

The spirit and intent of RTI Act, is secured and prompted by the Commercial Staff Training Institute, by conducting exclusive session on Right to Information for the Public Information Officers and Appellate Authorities on 28.06.2018, 09.07.2018 and 16.07.2018. Likewise refresher course was also conducted at Regional Chapters (Vellore, Coimbatore, Salem, Madurai, Trichy and Tirunelveli) for Assistant Commissioners, Commercial Tax Officers, Deputy Commercial Tax Officers, with exclusive session on Right to Information.

List of various schemes to the traders and eligibility criteria and relevant Government orders were uploaded in the Public Domain of the Traders Welfare Board www.tn.gov.un/tntwb.

Finance Department

During 3rd week of every month, a review meeting has been convinced by the Principal Secretary to Government (Expenditure) with all officers in Finance Department and Heads of Departments to review the pending petitions received under the RTI Act Instructions are given to

clear all the RTI petitions expeditiously as per the provision of the RTI Act.

Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation Limited

Special Register is being maintained for RTI applications. Necessary instructions have been given to all the Deputy Managers / Tahsildars in this regard.

<u>Commissionerate of Revenue Administration and Disaster</u> <u>Management</u>

To ensure timely providing of information to public, a special effort taken to supervise and disposal of petitions by maintaining a register. RTI awareness pamphlets were issued to public.

Directorate of Tamil Etymological Dictionary Project

Manual of the Directorate has been made available in the Government website for information of the public.

Motor Vehicles Maintenance Department

To create awareness and knowledge of the RTI Act, the staff of this Department are periodically sent to training at Anna Institute of Management, Chennai.

Institute of Road Transport, Chennai

One day training programme is regularly conducted at the Institute of Road Transport, Taramani, Chennai in order to create awareness of RTI Act, 2005 and rules therein to the staff / Officers of Institute of Road Transport.

10.8. Recommendations for reform or improvement of the Act or any other law relevant to operationalising the right to access to information [Section 25(3)(g)]

Anna University

Periodical Training Programmes may be conducted by the Government to the Public Information Officers and First Appellate Authorities to enlighten them the latest rulings given by the Commission. Amendment may be made to restrict number of queries raised in a single petition.

Director General of Police, Tamil Nadu

Awareness Programmes on RTI Act is to be conducted to both the Government Officials and to the public.

Water Resource Department, Chennai Region

Some petitioners are seeking information in the mode of threatening the officials continuously and to divert the manpower wantonly. Provision may be made in the Act to give powers to the officers to identify such persons and to take action against them for misusing the Act.

<u>Commissionerate of Revenue Administration and Disaster</u> <u>Management</u>

Separate staff should be appointed. Provisions may be made to filter the request made for certain irrelevant information. Since the replies to the RTI petitions are sent by RPAD, the allotment for postal charges may be increased to 60% in addition to normal allotment. The RTI fees

may be enhanced from Rs.10 to 50 or 100. Necessary training may be given to Government Employees in regular intervals.

Commissionerate of Tourism

Periodical Training may be given on RTI to the officers for updating and sessions may be organized for exchange of views about the mode of disposal of other departments.






Disposal of Second Appeals during the year 2018

CHAPTER - 12

Recommendations of the Commission to the Government

- (1) Section 25(2) of the RTI Act, 2005 mandates that each Ministry or Department shall in relation to the Public authorities within their jurisdiction, collect and provide such information to the State Information Commission, as is required to prepare the Annual Report. But it has been found that most of Departments submit their reports belatedly, which in turn makes further delay in preparation and submission of the Annual Report to the Government in time. The Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department which is the nodal department on RTI should issue necessary instructions to all the Departments of Secretariat to strictly adopt a procedure to submit their reports pertaining to the previous year within two months of the next year.
- (2) An appeal under sub-section (1) or sub-section (2) of the RTI Act, 2005 shall be disposed of within thirty days of the receipt of the appeal or within such extended period not exceeding a total of forty-five days from the date of filing thereof as the case may be for reasons to be recorded in writing. But it has been observed that the most of the First Appellate Authorities do not act as per the above provision of the Act and they simply forward the first appeal to the Public Information Officer concerned to provide the information required by the RTI petitioner. The failure on the part of the First Appellate Authorities to act strictly in accordance with the above provision seems to be the main reason for the RTI petitioners to prefer Second Appeals to the Commission. The

Commission therefore recommends that the State Government should ensure that the Appellate Authorities in every Public Authority should comply with the appeal provisions under Section 19(1) of the RTI Act, 2005.
